Lord Jesus Christ, your birth at Bethlehem draws us to kneel in wonder at heaven touching earth: Accept our heartfelt praise as we worship you, our Sayiour and our eternal God. **Amen.**

ISAIAH 9.2-7

The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who lived in a land of deep darkness on them light has shined. You have multiplied the nation, you have increased its joy; they rejoice before you as with joy at the harvest, as people exult when dividing plunder. For the yoke of their burden, and the bar across their shoulders, the rod of their oppressor, you have broken as on the day of Midian. Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John *All* **Glory to you, O Lord.**

John 1.1-14

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. All things came into being through him, and without him not one thing came into being. What has come into being in him was life, and the life was the light of all people. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it. There was a man sent from God, whose name was John. He came to what was his own, and his own people did not accept him.
