NEW TESTAMENT:

Hebrews 9.24-end

For Christ did not enter a sanctuary made by human hands, a mere copy of the true one, but he entered into heaven itself, now to appear in the presence of God on our behalf. Nor was it to offer himself again and again, as the high priest enters the Holy Place year after year with blood that is not his own; for then he would have had to suffer again and again since the foundation of the world. But as it is, he has appeared once for all at the end of the age to remove sin by the sacrifice of himself. And just as it is appointed for mortals to die once, and after that the judgement, so Christ, having been offered once to bear the sins of many, will appear a second time, not to deal with sin, but to save those who are eagerly waiting for him.

Leo the Great (Leo I): Feast Day 10th November

Leo the Great, was bishop of Rome from 29 September 440 until his death in 461. Pope Benedict XVI said that Leo's papacy "was undoubtedly one of the most

important in the Church's history."

He galvanized charitable works in a Rome beset by famines, an influx of refugees, and poverty. He further associated the practice of fasting with charity and almsgiving. It was during Leo's papacy that the term "Pope", which previously meant any bishop, came to exclusively mean the Bishop of Rome.

The church has been established in Bolton le Sands since 1094. Since then, throughout the centuries, it has been a parish church to pray, lead services, take care, support in good times and bad the people of this village and Nether Kellet.

We continue to do this at present, as we celebrate with people who have been married, baptized, and or confirmed in church, and supported people during difficult times of their lives.

Your church is a vibrant church. It is open each day for people to visit, pit stop, rest, pray and gain some peace and direction. We also hold regular services and village supportive events such as our first Tuesday Hub, and village carol services.

We want to see Holy Trinity and St Mark's continue to be vibrant churches with its own vicar in the coming years. For this to occur, we do need more help from people and financial support. To run the village churches costs over £90,000. per year.

This year, our Treasurer estimates we will have a shortfall of £16K.

For others who value the presence of the church, enjoy walking through the grounds, visit the church or attend any of our services we are asking whether you would consider making a financial donation to the church.
